

Undergraduate Admission – State Testing Requirements:

The North Carolina State Board of Education has identified three tests that can serve as admissions tests for undergraduate teacher education programs to provide evidence of competency with Pre-Professional Skills level. Qualifying scores from at least one of these tests must be submitted to the Wake Forest Education Department Licensure Office as part of the TEP Application Process. If Candidates submitted SAT or ACT scores to Wake Forest during admissions, they may be able to request a copy of their scores from the Office of Academic Advising (125 Reynolda Hall). If Wake Forest does not have scores, the candidate must procure scores through the College Board or ACT. Candidates should plan accordingly as this request may take several weeks.

Scores should be submitted to the Licensure Officer as soon as possible but no later than January 1st of the Junior Year for Elementary Education Majors or April 1st of the Junior Year for all Secondary and Second Language Minors.
